Getting to know this month's speakers

Wray Dudley, AB4SF, has been licensed since 1964 when WN4VXR went on the air. From 1971-1974, Wray was an Electronics Technician (Radar) on the Coast Guard Cutter Ingham. He ran hundreds of phone patches for the crew of the Ingham, including some through WA4SSG. For over 30 years, Wray has maintained the weather radar and computers and transmitters at WWBT-TV. Wray is an avid RTTY contester and DXer with a great deal of experience in HF digital modes.

Jim Bates, KJ4WLH, is an IT professional by day and the gateway administrator for the W4FJ D Star repeater by night. Jim does a bit of international travel for work and often takes his D Star HT with him so he can stay in touch with Club members from exotic locations. Jim's ham interests focus on VHF and UHF, but he also operates HF digital modes.

Join Wray and Jim as they present a live demonstration of PSK 31, JT 65 and possibly some other modes using free software and familiar HF transceivers.

From the Prez

This month I have a number of odds and ends to convey. First, a big thank you to those who participated in Field Day. Robert Orndorff, W4BNO, and the RATS team did a great job of organizing and setting up the stations. My thanks to the RARC members who participated. Robert tells me there were at least 25 people in attendance most of Saturday. And thanks also to Allan Johnson, WA3J, and his helpers who conducted VE testing at Field Day.

We have some excellent programs lined up for the next few months. As you will see in this newsletter, our July program by Wray Dudley, AB4SF, and Jim Bates, KJ4WLH, will be a live demonstration of HF digital modes. Joe Palsa introduced this topic last month, and at the next meeting you will see some of the most popular of these modes in action.

I received an email recently from a member who lamented the lack of activity on our area FM repeaters and the difficulty of making HF contacts with compromise antennas. HF digital modes work amazingly well with simple antennas and minimal power. If that's your situation, the July program will show you how a modest HF station can work DX on digital modes surprisingly well. I know because I worked a number of DX contacts using PSK 31 with a dipole and low power for years.

In August, Jim Bates will present a program on D Star. I know this mode is not everyone's cup of tea (it happens to be mine), but there are some interesting things you may not know about D Star. Icom has actually reduced prices on some of their D Star radios, maybe not enough to get you over the price barrier, but at least the prices have moved in the right direction.

In September, Armand Hamel, WA1UQO, will present a program where everyone can actually build something that you will take home with you after the meeting. The prototype has been produced, and I think

you will enjoy not only the experience, but also the finished product.

I have appointed a nominating committee to propose a slate of officers and directors for next year. I know that Ron Chase, Marshall Ervine and Dave Thomas would welcome your suggestions.

I have also appointed a D Star Repeater Committee currently consisting of Mike Owens, K4RKO, Jim Bates, KJ4WLH, Wray Dudley, AF4SF, Allan Johnson, WA3J and myself. The immediate task is to move the D Star repeater gear and gateway to a new rack cabinet that was donated to the Club some years ago. We also plan to replace the Heliax to the antennas when the weather cools off. Down the road, we will be looking at integrating some commercial radio gear in place of the Icom RF decks to improve receiver performance. This has been done successfully by a number of D Star repeater operators around the world with dramatic improvements in receive performance.

I hope to see everyone at the meeting on July 12.
