1) Ken Leidner, (WV0L) gave the Treasurer's Report. We had an ending balance of \$18,957.24 The Report was approved unanimously by voice vote.

President John DeMajo reported that the Board of Directors will be considering support for the Virginia QSO Party award that the club sponsors each year at the next directors meeting.

Bruce MacAlister, (W4BRU) reported that the license classes will be using the Gordon West books for the Spring classes. Ken Zutavern (K4ZUT) explained that Gordon West books seemed to work better for license prep. Ken Leidner, (WV0L) showed an example of an explanation of Ohnm's law from the Technician class book. Bruce also reported that the Middle School classes are continuing well.

John DeMajo also noted the passing of two club members, Dr. Joe Palsa, K3WRY and Lew Best, W4LEW.

The business meeting was adjourned at 20:00 and followed by the traditional December Social hour.

Greetings from the pres..

Well we survived the holidays and thankfully 2021 is history. Hopefully 2022 will be a better year for us all. I am excited about a number of prospects and programs that we have on the table. First, our project with the 6th Graders at Woodson Middle School should go off, according to schedule, toward the end of February. Let's all keep our fingers crossed that bad weather or illness will not cancel school on the day of the program.

We also will be trying our first hybrid license classes this spring. Beginning with the spring classes, we will be teaching from the Gordon West series of books, which many people believe to be much easier to understand than the ARRL manuals we had been using. Bruce McAlister W4BRU, has designed a system to make it uniform for all of the instructors to be able to teach from an assigned classroom at Bon Air Methodist, while still being able to present the class to our Zoom applicants. While we feel that in-person classroom teaching is vital, we are also getting more and more out-of-the-area students because of our ability to teach remotely. In this case, one of the work-arounds that was the result of last year's Covid lockdown, actually had a beneficial result on the club in that we have expanded our service area to be able to accept students from other localities, many of which do not have clubs teaching General or Extra classes. We are also planning an inperson "boot camp" for new hams that will probably be held in late spring.

Once again, I am calling on members for ideas on programs and presentations at our meetings. RARC is an excellent place to learn through our own members and guest presenters who are experts or have experience in certain fields. If you have a subject that you would like to know more about, or if you or someone you know would like to share their knowledge on a subject, we have plenty of openings at future meetings to schedule a session.

Finally, I am announcing that the club is looking for a volunteer to act as the club's property manager. That individual will be responsible for keeping track of all equipment owned by the club. The position also extends to evaluating and accepting equipment or historical material donations that are offered, and seeing that any property received is either deployed for club purposes, passed on to members who want it, or that it is disposed of through auction or recycling. If you have some time and might be willing to provide this service to the club, please contact me and we will work out the details.

Again, best wishes to everyone for a healthy and productive 2022.

Pre-registration Required. Walk-ins Accepted. Pre-Registration required for Techs and for special needs applicants. Anyone taking the Tech exam needs a FRN from the FCC (Google obtaining a FCC FRN) and bring that info to the session. 2. KC4TS Cats Vet (Cats Volunteer Examination Team) offers VE Testing Sessions that cost \$15.00 on the 1st Saturday of every month. Currently all testing starts at 10:00 AM and is at: Gospel Light Church 2109 Anderson Hey Powhatan VA. Check-in is between 10am and 12pm and we stay as long as needed to finish all the exams. Walk-in candidates are welcome! You just need a valid ID, an individual FCC FRN, and the testing fee of \$15 which goes directly to the ARRL (cash or check made payable to "ARRL VEC"). Nets

RARC has the first and only D-STAR digital repeater in the area. 147.255 (+ 600), 443.7125 (+ 5) and now 1284.0000 (-20). In addition to our Wednesday local D Star net (below), we link the D Star VHF module for the National Capital Region D Star Net on Wednesday nights at 9pm. On Tuesday nights at 9pm, we link our VHF module to the North Carolina D Star Net, and on Sunday nights at 9pm to the South Eastern D Star Weather Net.

Beginning on March 5, 2014, the RARC D Star Net which meets on Wednesday nights at 8:00pm will be accessible on our three D Star modules, all of which will be linked.

You can use any of the three frequencies, 2 meters, 70 cm or 23 cm, and you should hear and be heard by everyone.

If you participate in the net via DVAP or DV Dongle, you must link your device to Ref 062D rather than to any of our modules. Since the W4FJ stack will all be linked to Ref 062D, anyone linked to that reflector will be connected to the net.

Virginia Section Manager Joe Palsa, K3WRY,

of North Chesterfield, Virginia, died on December 7. An ARRL Life Member, he was 80.

Palsa was appointed Virginia Section Manager in February 2015, and had since won elections in his own right. A radio amateur for more than 50 years, he also served as the Virginia State Government Liaison.

Palsa held a PhD in electronics technology and was a Life Member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). He enjoyed researching and designing ham equipment and building projects, including some specialized military applications on electromagnetic compatibility (EMC), electromagnetic interference (EMI), and electromagnetic pulse (EMP). His professional experience included design, product development, and application engineering support, as well as positions in senior sales and marketing and senior executive management.

During 2014, he served as president of the Richmond Amateur Radio Club. In past years, he has held ARRL Field Organization positions as Official Bulletin Station (OBS), Official Observer (OO), and Official Emergency Station (OES).

Active in the Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®), he received two ARRL public service awards. Palsa enjoyed DXing, contesting, and public service communication.
