From The Prez

According to the ARRL bulletin issued in March 2025, "the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) issued a Public Notice titled "In Re: Delete, Delete, Delete," seeking input from the public on FCC rules that may be outdated, unnecessary, or in need of modification. This inquiry is part of the FCC's ongoing effort to alleviate regulatory burdens across various services, including the Amateur Radio Service".

Many of us, as well as the ARRL, are concerned that this action may potentially open opportunities for larger commercial organizations to use their influence during the FCC review to seek portions of the amateur radio frequency spectrum.

Many of you who are ARRL members may have already replied to the ARRL's request for comment on this matter. Additionally, all of us can voice our concerns about the potential risk associated with this action to our congressmen in Washington, making sure our concerns are known. We must remain vigilant in order to protect the amateur radio frequency spectrum for the future.

RARC has the first and only D-STAR digital repeater in the area: 147.255 (+ 600), 443.7125 (+ 5) and 1284.0000 (-20). In addition to our Wednesday local D Star net (below), we link Module C (VHF) on Tuesday nights at 9pm, to REF 054C for the North Carolina D Star Net.

The RARC D Star Net meets on Wednesday nights at 8:00pm and is accessible on our three D Star modules, all of which will be linked together via REF 097B. So if you are in RF range of the repeater, you can join the net on any of the three RF modules and be heard by everyone.

If you participate in the net via DVAP, DV Dongle or a Hotspot (such as Pi Star), you should link your device to REF 097B rather than to any of our modules which will allow you to be heard by everyone.

Notable YL Amateurs

It's impossible to talk about notable female hams without acknowledging the work of Clara Reger, who received her call sign in 1933 at age thirty-five. Reger had a long career as an operator, and managed disaster communications after WWII. Known for her exceptional Morse code skills, Reger spent much of her life teaching others how to become operators. She also received the Edison Award for teaching a fourteen-year-old boy without arms to send Morse code with his feet.

But Reger is also known for her signature salutation, which she created especially for women communicating with other women—the salutation '33,' which meant love sealed with friendship. Reger knew that to hear another girl's voice on the other end was rare and special. What a gift, to find kinship with women, through the radio, across the ocean, across the globe!

YL 33 is considered sacred by female hams, and there's a poem dedicated to Reger's accomplishments and passion for radio communications. You can read it in full on the Young Ladies Radio League's website, but here's a passage:

There's no real definition
 But its meaning is known well.

 It's how a YL says good evening
 To another friend YL.
