RARC has the first and only D-STAR digital repeater in the area: 147.255 (+ 600), 443.7125 (+ 5) and 1284.0000 (-20). In addition to our Wednesday local D Star net (below), we link Module C (VHF) on Tuesday nights at 9pm, to REF 054C for the North Carolina D Star Net. The RARC D Star Net meets on Wednesday nights at 8:00pm and is accessible on our three D Star modules, all of which will be linked together via REF 097B. So if you are in RF range of the repeater, you can join the net on any of the three RF modules and be heard by everyone.

If you participate in the net via DVAP, DV Dongle or a Hotspot (such as Pi Star), you should link your device to REF 097B rather than to any of our modules which will allow you to be heard by everyone.

#### Show and Tell!



# From The Prez

Maintaining a successful amateur radio club requires consistent effort across several areas—community building, education, organization, and outreach. Here's a practical guide to help keep your club active, engaging, and growing:

#### 1. Strong Communication

- Regular Meetings: Monthly meetings with a consistent time and location (or virtual option).
- Clear Communication Channels: Use a mailing list, website, social media, or a group chat (e.g., Discord or Groups.io) to keep members informed.
- **Newsletter:** Monthly or quarterly newsletters with updates, events, member spotlights, and technical tips.

### 2. Engaging Activities

- On-Air Events: Host nets, contests, and special event stations.
- **Field Days:** Participate in ARRL Field Day or similar events. Encourage setup teams, loggers, and food/social crews.
- Workshops & Presentations: Rotate topics—antennas, digital modes, emergency comms, satellite ops, etc.
- **Build Nights:** Organize soldering/build projects like antenna tuners, QRP rigs, or Raspberry Pi-based loggers.

#### 3. Welcoming Culture

- Mentoring ("Elmering"): Pair new hams with experienced members.
- Inclusive Environment: Welcome operators of all backgrounds, ages, and skill levels.
- Recognition: Acknowledge members' accomplishments (upgrades, DXCC, event participation, etc.).

#### 4. Clear Leadership & Goals

- Active Leadership: Officers should be committed and responsive.
- Defined Roles: Have clear responsibilities for president, secretary, treasurer, event coordinator, etc.
- Plan Ahead: Maintain a yearly calendar of events, elections, and special activities.

#### 5. Community Outreach

- Public Demonstrations: Set up at local fairs, science nights, or emergency preparedness events.
- License Classes: Offer Technician and General license prep classes.
- Youth Engagement: Partner with schools, Scouts, or STEM groups.
- Emergency Services: Connect with local ARES/RACES or CERT programs.

#### 6. Financial Health

- Dues: Keep them affordable but adequate to support club needs.
- Fundraising: Raffles, silent auctions, or gear sales.
- Grants: Apply for ARRL grants or community STEM funding.

#### 7. Club Infrastructure

- Repeater System: If available, maintain it well and encourage its use.
- Website: Keep it updated with meeting info, resources, and contact details.
- Club Call Sign: Use it for events, contests, and field day.

# 8. Continuing Education

- Host sessions on new modes (FT8, POTA, Winlink).
- Encourage members to experiment and share results.
- Promote ARRL, local hamfests, and regional conventions.

I'll let you be the judge if this is a conclusive list, or if something is missing. I believe the longevity of the RARC is due to its tradition of fulfilling many of the task necessary to maintain our club as outlined above. I am grateful for the many contributions made by our membership in sharing their time and expertise in support of our club.
