RARC has the first and only D-STAR digital repeater in the area: 147.255 (+ 600), 443.7125 (+ 5) and 1284.0000 (-20). In addition to our Wednesday local D Star net (below), we link Module C (VHF) on Tuesday nights at 9pm, to REF 054C for the North Carolina D Star Net. The RARC D Star Net meets on Wednesday nights at 8:00pm and is accessible on our three D Star modules, all of which will be linked together via REF 097B. So if you are in RF range of the repeater, you can join the net on any of the three RF modules and be heard by everyone.

If you participate in the net via DVAP, DV Dongle or a Hotspot (such as Pi Star), you should link your device to REF 097B rather than to any of our modules which will allow you to be heard by everyone.

W4FJ Analog FM Test

The W4FJ repeaters, commonly thought of as the D Star repeaters, are all dual mode repeaters. They will repeat an analog FM signal just like they repeat D Star digital signals.

To test the coverage in analog FM mode, we will hold a one time net on October 15, 2025 at 8:30 pm, following the weekly RARC D Star net. We will conduct the net on the UHF module, 443.7125, + 5 MHz, with a PL tone of 74.4 Hz.

There is no way to link the three repeaters in analog mode like we do for the D Star net, and there is no ability to access the repeaters in analog mode using a hotspot.

Please help us check the coverage of the UHF module in analog FM mode by joining us on October 15.

ARRL Launches Nationwide Grassroots Campaign to Pass Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act

ARRL has launched a nationwide grassroots campaign aimed at securing the passage of federal legislation that would grant Amateur Radio Operators the same rights to install antennas on their property as those enjoyed by users of TV antennas, wireless internet, and flagpoles.

The campaign, announced in an ARRL Member Bulletin on September 17, 2025, follows the reintroduction of the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act in February 2025 (see ARRL News 02/07/2025). The bipartisan bills -- H.R.1094 in the House and S.459 in the Senate -- are designed to prevent restrictive homeowners' association (HOA) rules that currently prohibit or severely limit the installation of amateur radio antennas, even when

such antennas are hidden in trees, placed in attics, mounted on vehicles, or look like flagpoles.

"This legislation is about restoring equal rights to licensed Amateur Radio operators," said ARRL President Rick Roderick. "These restrictions hinder not only the enjoyment of Amateur Radio, but also its vital role in emergency communication during disasters."

Public Support Needed for Passage
To advance the legislation, ARRL is calling on its members and all licensees of the US Amateur Radio Service to take action by sending letters to their congressional representatives. Through a dedicated online tool at https://www.arrl.org/HOA, hams can easily generate and submit pre-drafted letters with a few clicks.

ARRL has emphasized that every letter matters. "Your Representative and Senators need to know that the passage of this legislation is important to vou."
