RARC has the first and only D-STAR digital repeater in the area: 147.255 (+ 600), 443.7125 (+ 5) and 1284.0000 (-20). In addition to our Wednesday local D Star net (below), we link Module C (VHF) on Tuesday nights at 9pm, to REF 054C for the North Carolina D Star Net. The RARC D Star Net meets on Wednesday nights at 8:00pm and is accessible on our three D Star modules, all of which will be linked together via REF 097B. So if you are in RF range of the repeater, you can join the net on any of the three RF modules and be heard by everyone.

If you participate in the net via DVAP, DV Dongle or a Hotspot (such as Pi Star), you should link your device to REF 097B rather than to any of our modules which will allow you to be heard by everyone.

RATS Repeater (146.88) Upgrade!

An FM broadcast notch filter was installed on the receive side of the 146.88 repeater Saturday morning. This has significantly improved the performance of the repeater's receiver. The repeater still experiences a small amount of de-sense when operating at full power (50 watts). Additional filtering and/or a cavity duplexer tune-up may be needed. Transmitter power is set at 50 watts. Performance observations and feedback are requested by our Technical Committee, techcomm@rats.net.

Might this simple \$22 part be the solution to years of increasing noise in the repeater's receiver? Time will tell if this is "the" fix, but it sure is helping. The filter attenuates signals in the FM broadcast band (88-108 MHz) by about 60-70 dB. There are several powerful FM broadcast transmitters co-located at our repeater site and on other nearby towers. The high RF generated by those transmitters was making it past our 6-cavity duplexer, de-sensitizing the repeater. The filter prevents those unwanted signals from overpowering the receiver. The amount of de-sense was influenced considerably by the repeater's transmitter power. Over the past couple of years, power had been reduced to 20 watts, and then to 5 to combat the noise. This de-sense has been nearly eliminated and the repeater is back to full output power.

The 146.88 repeater carries analog FM and digital C4FM traffic, and it's connected to the global <u>WIRES-X network</u>. Digital traffic is primary on this repeater; analog users must yield to C4FM and WIRES-X activity.


